### A brief history of the IMS

- ▶ **Apr 1976**: Agreement to form IMS.
- ▶ Dec 1976: First proper meeting: IMS fully formed.
- ▶ **1978**: First issue of IMS Newsletter/Bulletin.
- ▶ **Sep 1988**: First "September" scientific meeting of IMS.
- ▶ Apr 2004: First joint international meeting: BMC in Belfast.
- ► Apr 2016: 40th anniversary meeting.

### Aims and Structure

- The IMS aims to further Mathematics and Mathematical research in Ireland.
- ► Membership is international, but mainly represents mathematicians in Universities and other 3rd level institutes in Ireland.
- Other members are from various professions (e.g. school teachers) and also students.
- ► All-Ireland organisation
- ▶ 134 ordinary members + 160 other members (retired, reciprocal, life, honorary, student, etc.)
- Officers: President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer.
- ► Committee of 12–14, including the officers
- ▶ One current subcommittee: IMSEC, the Educational Committee

- AGM and Committee meetings
- Main scientific meeting ("September" meeting)
- Occasional joint meetings (BMC, IMTA, etc.)
- Supported meetings
- ► IMS Bulletin
- ► IMS Website
- ► IMSEC: Educational Committee

## "September" and joint meetings

- ➤ Since 1988, the IMS has had one main scientific meeting per year, the "September" meeting: traditionally in September, but sometimes at end-August in recent years.
- ▶ It has moved to April three times (two joint BMC meetings, 40th anniversary meeting).
- ▶ It is typically a two-day meeting, but sometimes is longer.
- ▶ It moves around every year: most recent meetings in Sligo, Cork, Belfast, Maynooth, Tallaght, Limerick. 2018 meeting in Dublin.
- ▶ IMS business meetings usually held during "September" meeting.

### Supported meetings

The IMS provides limited support to a number of meetings per year. In 2017, it supported eight meetings:

- ► Mathematics Learning and Support: Derry

#### IMS Bulletin

- ► The IMS Newsletter was first published in 1978, initially once per year, but twice per year since 1982.
- From Issue 15 (March 1986), the Newsletter became the IMS Bulletin
- ▶ It seeks to inform IMS members, and the mathematical community at large, about the activities of the IMS and about items of general mathematical interest.
- ▶ It publishes:
  - surveys
  - biographical and historical articles
  - short research articles
  - Irish thesis abstracts
  - book reviews and letters
- ► Free to members; €30/yr to libraries.
- ▶ All issues (80 to date) free to download on IMS website.

### **IMSEC**

$$\label{eq:IMSEC} \begin{split} \text{IMSEC} &= \text{IMS Educational Committee discusses issues and formulates} \\ \text{positions concerning Mathematics education.} \end{split}$$

Recent actions include:

- ▶ The creation of a "short guide to second level mathematics".
- ▶ Discussion of the 2nd level Applied Mathematics curriculum.
- ► Sought increased 3rd level representation on the "Maths Development Group", an advisory group that discusses 2nd level curriculum matters.

### External relations and outreach

- Sought national research support for Mathematics on several occasions.
- ► Sought increased 3rd level representation on the "Maths Development Group".
- Ran Exploring Mathematics Conference for 700 second-level students.
- ▶ We liaise with Royal Irish Academy on various matters.
- Links to other organisations, in Ireland and international.
- Reciprocity membership with other societies (EMS, AMS, DMV, etc.).
